NIHR Global Health Research

The UK-based National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR) is looking for applications for the <u>Global Health Research (GHR) – Researcher-led programmes</u>. These programmes fund research to improve health outcomes for the most vulnerable people in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs). Research must address evidence needs that are locally identified and prioritised, and must promote health equity, aligning with the aims of <u>Sustainable Development Goal 3</u>. Applications can span broad, ambitious programmes of research to projects with a narrower scope.

There are 3 programme bands of funding based on the scale and ambition of the proposed research, the maturity of partnerships, the teams' experience and expected capacity strengthening plans:

Programme band	Award details
<u>GHR – Researcher-led band 1</u> This is for more established research partnerships and experienced teams. This band is suitable for teams proposing a broad, ambitious programme of research and capacity strengthening.	 Band 1 offers £4.0m to £7.0m of funding per award, running for up to 5 years. Eligibility: Applications must include Joint Leads (LMIC-LMIC or LMIC-UK) at separate institutions. You must involve at least 2 DAC list countries and at least 3 separate institutions. To be successful in receiving GHR – Researcher-led band 1 funding, at least 10 academic training posts are required.
GHR – Researcher-led band 2 This is for developing or less mature research partnerships with varying levels of experience proposing to undertake a significant new programme of research, extend existing research and capacity strengthening, and/or include more LMIC settings.	 Band 2 offers £2.0m to £4.0m of funding per award, running for up to 4 years. Eligibility: Applications mustinclude Joint Leads (LMIC-LMIC or LMIC-UK) in separate institutions. You must involve at least 1 DAC list country and at least 2 separate institutions. To be successful in receiving GHR – Researcher-led band 2 funding, at least 4 academic training posts are required.
<u>GHR – Researcher-led band 3</u> This is for new research partnerships and/or less experienced teams. This band is suitable for teams proposing a research project which may be at an early or developmental stage. It may be delivered in a single country context	 Band 3 offers £0.25m to £2.0m of funding per award, running for up to 3 years. Eligibility: Applications can be for either a Sole LMIC Lead or Joint Leads (LMIC-LMIC or LMIC-UK) in separate institutions. You must involve at least 1 DAC list country and at least 1 institution. The inclusion of academic training posts are optional, however formal training posts (e.g. MSc, Post Doc) must be completed within project duration.

Submission process:

This proposal is a two-staged i.e., only shortlisted applicants will be invited to submit a stage 2 full application.

Important: This proposal requires the PI to complete an online application on the funder portal (<u>REALMS</u>) as well as requesting institutional approval via UCT's electronic Research Administration (<u>eRA</u>) system, prior to submission of the stage 1 application.

PI to submit the application on the funder portal (REALMS) no later than	30 October 2024
RC&I to action the final submission on the funder portal no later than	06 November 2024
