About the Funding Opportunity

This call supports research that explores how Artificial Intelligence (AI) is reshaping labour markets, productivity, and inequality across Africa, supporting policymakers to ensure AI works for everyone, especially the most vulnerable.

IDRC invites concept notes that explore the socio-economic impacts of AI in African low- and middle-income countries (LMICs), with a focus on differential impacts, inequality, and marginalized populations. Projects should address key knowledge gaps and generate evidence to guide responsible AI policies.

Research should align with one or more of the following themes:

- **Labour and Livelihoods:** How AI is transforming labour markets and employment, especially for youth and informal workers.
- Productivity and Economic Transformation: The role of AI in reshaping sectors and supporting inclusive growth.
- Poverty and Inequality: Risks of exclusion and unequal benefit distribution across demographic groups.
- **Global Inequality and AI Colonialism:** Power imbalances in AI development and strategies for local innovation.

Through this call, AI4D will award up to four grants for up to CAD1 million per project. Projects must be completed within 36 months, including all research and reporting activities. Only short-listed teams will be asked to submit full research proposals for review and funding consideration. Selected projects are anticipated to begin on 01 January 2026.

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must be legally registered organizations based in African LMICs, with relevant expertise and institutional capacity. Proposals and team expertise must align with the call's themes. Teams need to meet the eligibility criteria outlined in the call.

Submission Process

This call for concept notes requires the PI to complete an online application on the funder's portal, the <u>Survey Monkey application platform</u>, as well as request institutional approval via UCT's electronic Research Administration (eRA) system is required before submission.

Format and requirements for proposals

The <u>application form</u> for this call for concept notes includes nine fields that applicants will need to complete, considering the maximum number of words allocated per question.

Additional Required Documents and Information

As part of the application, applicants must prepare the following:

- One-page CVs for the PI and proposed team members
- Signed letters of commitment from each applicant organisation
- Legal registration documents
- High-level budget in local currency using the <u>IDRC budget template</u>. IDRC budget template (refer to IDRC's General Terms and Conditions for guidance <u>here</u>)
- Disclosure of any use of generative AI in the application development
- Optional supporting documents such as reference letters, consortium letters, workplans, stakeholder endorsements, and other relevant legal documents
